

PRIOR TO GAME/EVENT

- 1) ARRIVE ON TIME AT BANDHALL....if you are told to be there at 5:30, then arrive prior to that but not later as this makes the rest of the process get bogged down.
- 2) GLOVES.....gloves will be available for purchase each Friday morning in the bandhall PRIOR to school...8:10 am to 8:30 a m. Gloves will also be available for purchase from 5:15 pm until 5:45 pm on Friday prior to game. It is student's responsibility to make the time to purchase the gloves during these times. Correct change please.
- 3) GO TO UNIFORM RACKS....go to your uniform rack, find the hangar that has YOUR NAME and YOUR UNIFORM JACKET NUMBER on it. Remove your uniform from the hangar and LEAVE IT ON THE RACK IN ITS CORRECT ORDER.
- 4) GO TO GAUNTLET BOXES (in rack area).....take one pair of gauntlets in your size (S, M, L)...make sure that you have one LEFT and one RIGHT gauntlet before you leave the area.
- 5) GO TO BANDHALL....place your uniform on your chair...NOT ON THE FLOOR. Change your clothes. Place your personal clothing and items inside your band locker to secure them.
- 6) UNIFORM....make sure that all snaps are snapped; your silver cord is on left shoulder properly; gauntlets are on sleeves correctly.
- 7) GO TO UNIFORM ROOM....retrieve your hat, shoes, socks, gloves from your cubbie. Take them back to bandhall to put them on.
- 8) CLEAN YOUR SHOES....it is up to you to keep your shoes clean and shiny for each event. Wipes and towels are on table before each event. Place used towels IN THE GARBAGE CAN.
- 9) SOCKS...DO NOT attempt to wear black socks with white pants nor white socks with black pants. Your socks need to be clean for each game. It is Your responsibility to take them home and get them washed and bring them back with you.
- 10) HAT....place it on your head...secure with chin strap. BE CAREFUL to move chin strap only and not jerk on the chain across front..it will break.
- 11) PLUMES (aka "chickens")...will be distributed to you either before you exit your bus OR as you go to the warm-up circle. DO NOT ENTER stadium without one....only exceptions are those percussionists who do not wear hats. Plumes will be collected after half-time as you enter stands. DO NOT keep the plume with you in stands. They must be packed and sent back on the truck.

AFTER GAME/EVENT:

- 1) TAKE OFF UNIFORM.....return to bandhall and remove your uniform...place back on your chair. Follow the directions you are given about which uniform part will be cleaned that week. Go to the racks....retrieve YOUR HANGAR...check that it has YOUR NAME and YOUR UNIFORM NUMBER on it. Hang your uniform on the hangar CORRECTLY. Hang the uniform back on the correct rack in the order it goes. You can ask a uniform assistant at the racks for directions in hanging it properly but YOU are the one to hang it. They will show you what to do but you will be the one to do it. ANY uniforms not hung properly, will be reported to Mr. McAfee.
 - 2) GAUNTLETS...place the TWO gauntlets in their CORRECT box according to size...S,M,L
 - 3) HAT....place your hat inside its hat box inside your cubbie.
 - 4) SHOES....place your CLEAN shoes back in cubbie or take home.
 - 5) SOCKS and GLOVES....take items home to wash and then return clean for next game.
- AFTER you have placed your uniform back in its proper places, you may exit the building.

NOTE: Any problems with uniform or its pieces, are to be reported immediately in the proper form....write your JACKET NUMBER on the "Problems" pad on the uniform desk in uniform room. Then describe the problem..."loose snap on vest, pants too short, etc." One of the uniform moms will then check this list during week and correct problem. We CANNOT correct problems right before a game...report the problem as soon as you return to bandhall on Friday evening.

IF you have a spill on your uniform before or during a game....find one of the uniform moms in the stands and let us work on the problem if we can. If you lose a piece of uniform prior to game or during game, let us know immediately.

Your band uniform is your responsibility. It is a large part of your whole band experience. With proper care, these uniforms will continue to look good on the field and be a source of pride to those who are chosen to wear it.
